We are human rights defenders that monitor the observance of electoral and political rights of citizens.

On October 27, 2022, the UN special rapporteurs on the situation of human rights defenders, on the rights to freedom of peaceful assembly and of association issued a statement that explicitly recognized civic and international election observers as human rights defenders.





Since 2014, all **national elections** in Ukraine have been recognized as free, fair and democratic.

According to the 2021 edition of the Economist Intelligence Unit's Democracy Index, Ukraine was awarded 8.25 points in the "Electoral process and pluralism" category. This means that "the level of electoral democracy in Ukraine is on a par with that of the EU countries".

PARTICIPATION — SECURITY — JUSTICE

That's what we thought before the full-scale invasion:

"The exercise of voting rights means PARTICIPATION in the development of democracy in Ukraine. The ability to choose freely and feel confident about adequate protection of electoral choice gives us, Ukrainians, a sense of SECURITY and predictability of our political system. And the principle of JUSTICE is implemented through the application of legislation that ensures the inevitability of punishment".





"Political SECURITY — resilience to disinformation activities, transition to a civilian system of governance in the post-war period and stable peace, which is impossible to achieve without providing institutional security guarantees to Ukraine and putting an end to Russian influence on social, political, economic processes in our country. Social security also calls for investing in human capital and reducing conflicts between different groups of Ukrainians. **JUSTICE** — punishment of war criminals, special tribunal for Putin, gradual reintegration of the military and civilians, who survived the Russian occupation, into socio-political life of Ukraine. **PARTICIPATION** — involvement of citizens in socio-political processes and post-war reconstruction of our country".

We conduct investigations and research studies, in which we reveal the origins and primary sources, **interrelations and influences**.


We analyze the **public opinion** on a permanent basis to compare our decisions with the public demands.
